Redhat linux commands cheat sheet

Many Linux commands you type at a shell prompt are not that different from the commands you would type either in MS-DOS or in Windows (from the MS-DOS prompt). In fact, some commands are identical. What follows are some common commands used at the MS-DOS prompt in Windows 9x, and in Linux, as well as a basic example of how the command is used at the Linux shell prompt. Note that these commands usually have a number of options. To learn more about each command, read its associated man page (for example, type man ls at the shell prompt to read about the ls command). Red Hat Enterprise Linux (RHEL) comes with a variety of different tools to manage and configure operating system services and included applications - but the scope of tools and services can be overwhelming. In real life, most administrators are going to use the same types of commands to perform routine tasks, so you don't need to know all the thousands of potential commands and services. When you master the basics, you can manage your infrastructure for most required tasks. These cheat sheets work to simplify and clarify managing RHEL systems by showing common commands for common scenarios. These are references (not manuals or how-tos), but they can be handy tools when you need to try a new command or remember how to do something.
